**TAKE NOTICE THAT:**

1. A Judgment and an Order have been filed against you on the 29th March 2017 ("the Judgment"), and 24th March 2017 ("the Order"), respectively, in the Supreme Court of The Bahamas in Action No. 2014/CLE/gen/FP/263 by Finance Corporation of Bahamas Limited, the Plaintiff herein.
2. By the Order, the Court:

**DECLARED that:**

- 2.1. the Plaintiff is entitled to possession of Lot 114 Gladstone Terrace and Kitchener Avenue in Sunrise Park Subdivision in the City of Freeport and Lot 4107 in Pinewood Gardens Subdivision situate in the southern district of the Island of New Providence (collectively "the Mortgaged Properties"); and
- 2.2. the Plaintiff is entitled to exercise its power of sale over the Mortgaged Properties.

**AND ORDERED that:-**

- 2.3. Unless the Defendants, Andrew Andy Johnson and Vernita Yvonne Johnson pay all sums due under the Mortgage within 90 days of the date hereof, the Defendants, Andrew Andy Johnson and Vernita Yvonne Johnson be and are hereby ordered to deliver up vacant possession of the Mortgaged Properties to the Plaintiff on or before the 9th November 2016;
- 2.4. Judgment be entered by the Plaintiff against the Defendants, Andrew Andy Johnson and Vernita Yvonne Johnson in the sum of \$129,292.48, together with interest on the sum of \$116,705.35 at the rate of 8¼% per annum from the 14th July 2014 to the date of payment; and
- 2.5. The costs of and occasioned by this action are to be paid by the Defendants, Andrew Andy Johnson and Vernita Yvonne Johnson to the Plaintiff; such costs to be taxed, if not agreed.
3. By the Judgment, it was adjudged that you pay to the Plaintiff the sum of \$129,292.48 together with interest on the principal sum of \$116,705.35 at the rate of 8¼% per annum from the 14th July to the date of payment; and costs, to be taxed if not agreed.
4. Publication of this Notice constitutes service of the Order and Judgment, copies of which may be obtained from the Supreme Court Registry, Garnet Levarity Justice Centre, The Mall Drive, Freeport, Grand Bahama, The Bahamas during normal business hours.

**GENERAL ELECTIONS - WEDNESDAY, 10th MAY, 2017**

**SPECIAL VOTERS – FORM K**

In accordance with section 49C of the Parliamentary Elections Act (Chapter 7), a person who is a registered voter, may subject to application, vote as a **Special Voter** where:

- (a) the person is or is likely to be, on the day appointed for the taking of the poll, a patient in the hospital, nursing home, home for the aged or other institution for the treatment of any chronic illness or disability, except a person suffering from any mental disorder, psychopathic disorder or any subnormality of the mind, as defined by the Mental Health Act (Ch. 230), and such person is likely to be prevented by such illness, infirmity or disability from traveling to the polling place;
- (b) the person is by reason of illness, infirmity, pregnancy or recent childbirth unable to vote in the constituency in which he or she is registered on the day appointed for the taking of the poll;
- (c) the person, not being a person who qualifies to enroll as an overseas voter under section 49A, expects to be overseas on the day appointed for the taking of the poll;
- (d) the person is a candidate or the spouse of a candidate contesting the respective election;
- (e) the person is an election day worker, an election official or an employee of the Department of the Parliamentary Commissioner.

A person who, meeting the criteria above, wishes to vote as a special voter shall apply in writing in **Form K** to the Parliamentary Commissioner for a special voter certificate, **no later than Saturday, 29th April, 2017** to vote at the **Advanced Poll on Wednesday, 3rd May 2017**.
