

City of Sherman

The city of Sherman has a council-manager form of government. A seven-member council, headed by a mayor, which makes the major decisions of city government. These include approving a budget, developing comprehensive plans, conducting public construction projects and municipal laws.

A city manager is in charge of administration. The manager reports to the council, but has final authority on some matters.

Sherman City Hall

The Sherman City Hall, located at 220 W. Mulberry, houses many of the city's administrative offices, including the city manager and assistant city manager's office, code enforcement, engineering and the city clerk's office.

The Sherman Municipal Building, located at 405 N. Rusk, houses other city departments such as the utility billing department, human resources, finance department and neighborhood services.

Pilots have access to the facilities in the terminal building after hours by use of a simplex lock (the combination is the national aircraft emergency frequency). Fuel is self-service and an automated credit card system allows access to fuel after hours.

The function of the animal shelter is controlling stray and potentially dangerous animals, rescuing injured animals, and bringing lost pets to the Sherman Animal Shelter where their owners can reclaim them.

Hours

The Sherman Animal Shelter's operating hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday; 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and closed on Sunday. Animal control officers are on duty seven days a week, including holidays.

Animal adoption fees

Pet adoption is available for a nominal fee. The adoption fee includes examination, rabies vaccination and spay or neutering from a participating veteran.

City buildings Kidd-Key Auditorium

The Municipal Auditorium is located at 405 N. Rusk. This historic venue was completely renovated in 2001. A state of the art sound and light system was installed. Seating capacity is 1,300 including the balcony.
