School quilt sews together cultures

Sedgefield Intermediate School in Goose Creek has sewn together a cultural quilt to celebrate the ethnic diversity of its students.

The quilt was the final thread in the cultural project, which took months. Its completion was celebrated Feb. 1 at the school as students, parents, siblings, school and district staff, including Superintendent Anthony Parker and Principal Susan Best, attended.

The "Memories and Dreams" project began in September with reading and writing, school media specialist Carolyn Davis said. ESOL (English to Speakers of Other Languages) students were told to write a memory of their homeland and their personal dream. The 13 students, with backgrounds in eight different countries, then drew the memory and dream.

Summerville quilt storyteller and artist Peggie Hartwell came to the school in October and taught students the basic stitch, thus bringing art to the project. Hartwell supplied fabric, had it quilted and embroidered and provided additional volunteer quilters.

Hartwell's series "Africa On the Prairie" was inspired by Sudanese refugees she saw in Nebraska. Narrative quilt making is her voice on cloth, she said. When Davis approached Hartwell about working with the school, Hartwell asked about foreign students, Davis said.

"It was a joy to work with the kids. I hope they remember this forever," Hartwell said.

The students shared their memory and dream with the audience and pointed to their quilt squares.

Vinicius Marcial, of Brazil, remembers playing his favorite sport: soccer. His dream is to be a police officer or undercover FBI agent. Mary Bennett, of France, remembers the French flag. Her dream is to be an ice cream worker that gives free ice cream to the poor.

Karen Amezcua, of Mexican descent, remembers washing clothes with her grandmother. She said her dream is to live in California, where she was born, and open a Mexican restaurant.

Angelay Cassanova, of Puerto Rico, said she remembers camping at the beach, where there was no litter. She would like to be a rap dancer. Anna Ortega, of Mexico, said her dream is to be a doctor. Luis Rodriguez, also of Mexico, said his dream is to go 499 miles below water so more people can learn about fish.

Jayrads Villanueva, of the Philippines, said he wants to work with penguins in Galapagos. Jani Perez, of Guatemala, said his dream is to invent video games. Carol Sousa, of Brazil, said her dream is to be a doctor.

"I will create art until I die, even if I get famous," Lizbeth Paz, of Honduras, said.

Lyka Bugay, of the Philippines, wants to be a veterinarian because she loves

animals and wants to see different kinds of animals.

Wendy Alvarez, of El Salvador, was not present but ESOL teacher Shannon Cruz read her dream. Adrian Perez, of Mexico, participated in the program but was not present because he transferred to another school district.

Parents brought foods from their native countries to share with attendees.

"This is a school of learners for both adults and children," Best said.

Hartwell was given a bound book, signed by the students, containing each memory and dream. "You have given me a wonderful gift. Keep on dreaming . . . even about ice cream," Hartwell said.
